How Do I Order?

To Place an Order for Local Delivery

White Egret Farm delivers locally in the Austin area on a weekly basis. Please place your order by Tuesday at 5:00 P.M. Deliveries North of US Route 290/Koenig Lane/RM 2222 will take place on Wednesdays. All other deliveries will take place on Thursdays. You **do not** have to be home to accept a delivery. Just leave a cooler in a visible location and your farm delivery person will leave the product and ice it down. Your first delivery is **Free**. After that, deliveries are \$3.00. You may determine the frequency of your order. Some customers have standing orders for each week, others order every other week, or once a month, and some customers prefer to order as needed. You may leave a check or cash in your cooler.

To Place an Order for Shipment

White Egret Farm ships nation wide. Products are packed in special thick-walled thermal shippers with cardboard outer boxes. These boxes come in various sizes and may be re-used at home, or, if economics permit, they may be returned for credit towards your next order (credit for cooler portion only). These boxes are offered at our cost. Products are shipped with either gel packs, dry ice, or both. In the case of yogurt, gel packs are added simply to retard the fermentation.

During the months of March through October please place orders by Friday at 5:00 P.M. for shipping the following week. We need time to complete the paperwork associated with your order, assure that we have all the packing materials that we need, and that our production is sufficient for the week's orders. We also need time to meet the schedule of the particular shipping service that you choose (See below). Please order extra, so that you have a reserve should unforeseen circumstances delay the arrival of your shipment.

During the months of November through February, we will fill orders on a first-come-first-served basis. This is the time of year when the days are shortest, and milk production is lowest. Our goats respond to the amount of daylight and need energy for their pregnancies. They must be "dry" for the last 60 days of their pregnancy each year to regenerate their milk producing tissues.

Shipping

We try to work with our customers to minimize shipping costs, and we try to insure that our boxes reach their destination in **three days or less**. Most of our customers choose FedEx Ground Home Delivery™. This service runs Tuesday through Saturday, and we have found it to be the most economical service for most parts of the country. For customers outside the 3-day delivery range of FedEx Ground (the far Northeast and Northwest and Northern California), the next most reasonable service is Priority Mail™ by the US Post Office. This service costs more than FedEx Ground, but often gets packages to their destination in two days, and Priority Mail™ is delivered 6 days a week. Neither of these services, however, come with guaranteed delivery, but, we have found them to be about 95% accurate. For guaranteed service, we use FedEx 3rd day, 2nd day, or overnight delivery. These services guarantee an arrival time, but they are considerably more expensive. The choice of shipping services is up to you.

Insurance

Since most of our customers prefer to take advantage of the least expensive shipping methods, the farm will begin a program of self-insuring non-guaranteed shipments as of July 1, 2003. In the past customers have asked us to re-ship, at our expense, products that have become unusable, because they have been delivered late, or because they have been damaged during shipment. This situation is actually between the shipping service and the customer, and since no shipper is going to be 100% accurate, it has been an economic burden on the farm. Other customers, are also effected, especially in seasons where certain items may be in short supply. Nonetheless, we are dedicated to keeping our customers continually supplied with the products they need. To be fair to everyone, we will charge a \$2.00 insurance fee on all shipments sent via a non-guaranteed shipper. This will allow us to replace shipments should they arrive in unusable condition. We thank you in advance for your cooperation with this program.
